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About the Institution

'Marathwada Mitra Mandal', the charitable trust was established in 1967 in Pune with the objective of providing accommodation facilities to the students. Being established through an inspiration of socially and educationally inclined personalities, it serves with a motto 'Yethe Bahutanche Hit' (Welfare of Masses). At its various educational campuses, excellent facilities of education are provided to more than 12000 students pertaining to Architecture, Management, Law, Commerce, Pharmacy, Engineering, etc. Recently, four colleges of the institution have been accredited with 'A+'/'A' Grade by NAAC, Bengaluru and two colleges have been awarded the 'Best College Award' by Savitribai Phule Pune University.

About Marathwada Mitramandal's College of Commerce: Every year, students from Marathwada district and also from the rest of Maharashtra travel to Pune, to seek admission to colleges and institutes of repute. However, the biggest challenge for these young aspirants is the feeling of being 'out of place' in a big city. This sentiment struck a chord with Late Shri Shankarrao Chavan, former Home Minister of India, who was also the Founder President of Marathwada Mitra Mandal. In 1986, Marathwada Mitra Mandal, recognised the potential of business studies in commerce, with an aspiration to provide quality education, in a congenial and inclusive environment, especially to students from Marathwada region.

The college was the first in Pune city to be NAAC accredited in 2002. Over the years the college has undergone three cycles of accreditation and re-accreditation and was awarded 'A' grade in the last two cycles. In 2009 the college bagged 'The Best College of University of Pune' award.

The motto of our college is "Welfare of Masses" and we are committed to promoting and practicing the same through consistent and continuous social outreach activities. What started out as a commerce college, soon blossomed into an education hub offering various academic programs along with skill based multidisciplinary & certificate courses through its various centers like Indian Institute of Remote Sensing - Indian Space Research Organisation Nodal Center, Rural Entrepreneurship Development Cell (member of National Rural Entrepreneurship), Competitive Examination Center, Forum for Women Empowerment, etc.

With such a variety of courses and noteworthy achievements till date, the college continues to move on in its journey with its unwavering institutional values and best practices to make a mark on the wider national and international arena through societal concerns, linkages & collaborations and blessings of all. The college has a number of collaborations with institutions such as ICAI, ICSI, DeAsra, Center for Invention, Innovation & Incubation and many more that have benefited students in their pursuit of skill development.

About NAAC

India has one of the largest and diverse education systems in the world. Privatization, widespread expansion, increased autonomy and introduction of programmes in new and emerging areas have improved access to higher education. At the same time, it has also led to widespread concern on the quality and relevance of higher education. To address these concerns, the National Policy on Education (NPE, 1986) and the Programme of Action (PoA, 1992) spelt out strategic plans for the policies, advocating the establishment of an independent National accreditation agency. Consequently, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was established in 1994 as an autonomous institution of the University Grants Commission (UGC) with its headquarters in Bengaluru. The mandate of NAAC as reflected in its vision statement is in making quality assurance an integral part of the functioning of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

To maintain the quality assurance in HEI's, NAAC has been proactive in the commitment of its visions and goals through several activities. NAAC sponsored seminars is one of the major initiatives undertaken by the NAAC. The basic objective of these schemes is to enable organizations or institutions to organize seminars which will promote quality in institutions as well as programmes. Priority areas for support will be on quality sustenance and quality enhancement measures, promotion of assessment and accreditation, internal quality assessment systems, promotion and sharing of best practices and student participation in quality assurance or any quality related issues in higher education. Keynote Addresses

Inauguration of the Seminar:

Dr. Naresh Bodkhe, Hon'ble Director (Economics), Competition Commision of India, New Delhi had inaugurated the Seminar. He briefed the participants about the difference between vision statements and perspective plans and their applicability in realizing the vision of NEP 2020 in accordance to which all institutes would require to align and redefine their individual roadmaps. He discussed the interventions of NEP 2020 aimed at building the nation through the budding population. A vision, according to him, is what would drive an individual to achieve a broader goal whereas the perspective plans of an institute would define detailed plans. These plans depend on:

- 1. The stakeholders in NEP 2020: The important stakeholders being the students; the institutional perspective plans need to reflect their aspirations and expectations from the institutions. The other stakeholders include the parents, teachers, alumni, organization, community etc; in short society at large whose expectations would strengthen the plans through linkages, associations and collaborations to address the challenge of employability at local as well as global arena.
- 2. Capacity building of Educators: The essence of NEP 2020 can be realized through its suggestions on various factors such as multidisciplinary and outcome based education. Based on the revised curriculum framework and industry expectations, the educators need to be equipped with tools and technologies in the current digital scenario for their capacity building, towards which institutions need to plan accordingly.
- 3. Evolving a trust-based robust education system: All institutions need to have a perspective plan for incorporating a curriculum that has an outcome-based approach in tune with NEP 2020. The process of developing a holistic academic environment needs to be strengthened and supplemented by good governance and an evaluative process undergoing continuous scrutiny in tune with the dyanisms of the industries.

Dr. Naresh Bodkhe also emphasized on the need for including regional and local concerns in institutional plans on curriculum design to equip the rural and urban students for global opportunities. He concluded the session by pointing out the importance of education being the source of change and how the vision of NEP 2020 will be the driving force behind the change.

Session I: Prof. Dr. Sanjay Kharat

Prof. Dr. Sanjay Kharat, Principal, Modern College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Ganeshkhind conducted the First Session on the topic 'NAAC & Revised Online Assessment and Accreditation of Higher Education Institute'. In his address, he briefed the participants on the educational infrastructure, history of accreditation process and the changes expected to align with the National Education Policy 2020 that need to be incorporated in all institutional plans. He discussed on the revised accreditation process that involves the following:

- a. Involvement of Machine Learning & Artificial Intelligence
- b. Binary mode of accreditation
- c. Accreditation grading for academic programs instead of institutes
- d. Publishing of criteria wise benchmarks
- e. Outcome based accreditation

Session II: Mr. Pradeep Lokhande

Mr. Pradeep Lokhande, Founding member Rural Marketing Association of India was the Resource Person for the session-II. He enlightened participants on the topic 'Reimagining Teaching Learning Evaluation in Institutional Perspective Plans'. He discussed the changing expectations from teaching and learning in the context of NEP 2020 that need to be addressed by all institutions in their plans. He focussed on the importance and strengthening of experiential learning as part of multidisciplinary education and skill development in the curriculum as an institutional plan so as to make the students employable and provide employability. His talk focused on the critical thinking ability to generate positivity amongst the youth.

Session-III: CA Adwait Bamboli

CA Adwait Bamboli, Partner, AVB & Co, Senate member, Savitribai Phule Pune University conducted a session on the topic 'Reinventing New Channels for Collaborations in view of Research, Innovation and Extension Activities'. He highlighted objectives of NEP 2020 that envision the empowerment of students through vocational courses, skill enhancement, ability enhancement, value enhancement and open courses. He emphasized that the multidisciplinary approach encourages research and innovation. The institutes need to provide a roadmap to strengthen an ecosystem where the social entrepreneurs, industry experts and academicians collaborate to develop a center for invention, innovation and incubation in tune with the vision of NEP 2020 so as to address the societal or community concerns.

The session was graced by Hon. Dr. Prashant Bansode, Professor and Dean of Faculty, Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics. He spoke on "Extended Role of IQAC in Higher Education Institutions". His talk focused on the vision of NEP 2020 that can be realized through the strategy of the governing bodies and contribution of the IQAC. The institutional plan needs to have well defined mechanisms to strive for achieving the goals set by NEP 2020 and the objectives laid down by NAAC. He spoke about the quality of education in colleges and universities, the main focus being knowledge economy and society. According to Dr. P Bansode, the prime challenge of NEP 2020 is - multifarious and multifaceted education system that can be addressed through IQAC which promotes quality of education through dynamic systems and processes. He concluded his talk with the idea on how multidisciplinary education and multiple skills as the vision of NEP 2020 among the students will garner market value.










Outcome of the Seminar

The outcomes of the seminar are as follows:

- Information about the objective and functioning of NAAC: During the seminar, participants were communicated about the basic objectives of the NAAC as well as overall functioning of the NAAC inspection.
- Awareness about the Assessment and Accreditation Process: The participants learnt about the NAAC assessment and accreditation process in detail.
- ► The extended role of IQAC: The participants were made aware of the extended contributions of IQAC in developing a multidisciplinary outcome based approach in education
- ► Teaching Learning Evaluation process: The participants were informed about strengthening the quality education measures like continuous teaching learning evaluation with an objective to sustain in the global competition that needs to be reflected in the Institutional Perspective Plans with respect to NEP 2020
