### *Competition Highlights*

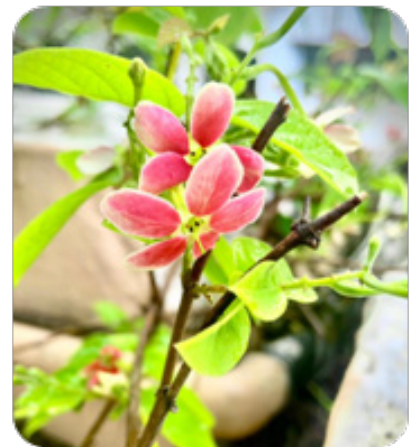
