To engage students, ma'am conducted a series of interactive activities that encouraged them to reflect on their own mindset. Students shared personal experiences where they succeeded through perseverance and where they learned from past mistakes.

This allowed the students to connect with the concept on a deeper level, fostering self-awareness and motivation.

The session ended with a Q&A session where students had the opportunity to ask questions about applying growth mindset in various situations Total students attended the lecture.
