## Report on Workshop on Nirmalya Collection and Eco-Friendly Ganpati Making

#### Introduction

To promote sustainable and environmentally responsible celebrations during Ganesh Utsav, Green Club, MMCC in collaboration with NGO Nisarg Sevak organized a **Workshop on Nirmalya Collection and Eco-Friendly Ganpati Making** on 18th August, 2025. The workshop aimed to spread awareness about reducing water pollution, minimizing non-biodegradable waste, and adopting green practices during religious festivals.

# **Objectives of the Workshop**

- To educate participants about **eco-friendly alternatives** for Ganesh idols instead of POP.
- To demonstrate the **use of terracotta soil** in making idols.
- To create awareness about scientific disposal of Nirmalya (floral offerings) through composting and recycling.
- To encourage active community involvement in **Nirmalya collection drives**.

### **Workshop Highlights**

The session was divided into **two segments**:

1. Eco-Friendly Ganpati Making

- Expert artisans Ms. Pradnya Satarkar, Sculptor guided participants in **idol making using** Teracota Soil.
- Demonstrations included shaping, detailing, and drying of idols, along with **using** organic colors for decoration.
- Participants enthusiastically crafted their own eco-friendly idols.

# 2. Nirmalya Collection and Management

- Ms. Aditi Tupe member of NGO Nisarag Sevak explained the impact of dumping Nirmalya into water bodies and scientific method of converting nirmalya into compost.
- Practical demonstrations were given on:
  - Segregating biodegradable and non-biodegradable materials.
  - Converting Nirmalya into compost and organic incense sticks.
- Students pledged to spread awareness and actively participate in Nirmalya collection during Ganesh Visarjan.

### Outcome

- Participants learned the **importance of sustainable festivals**.
- Hands-on experience in idol making using natural clay.
- Awareness about Nirmalva management and eco-friendly disposal practices.
- Commitment from participants to adopt green practices during Ganesh Utsav.
