Report on Cultural Activities - Academic Year 2024-25

The Academic Year 2024–25 at Marathwada Mitra Mandal's College of Commerce (MMCC) witnessed a distinguished lineup of cultural programmes designed to promote artistic talent, cultural literacy, and holistic student development. Presented below is a formal, chronological summary of all events conducted by the Cultural Department.

Classika - Classical Solo Dance Competition

The Cultural Department organized *Classika* on **29th August 2024**, offering students a platform to present classical dance forms. Participants showcased exemplary technique, rhythm, grace, and expression. The event was judged by expert faculty members and helped promote awareness and appreciation of India's classical performing arts. The Department extended gratitude to all participants and contributors for making the event successful.

Jallosh 2024 – Youth Festival (SPPU)

On **25th September 2024**, MMCC participated in *Jallosh 2024*, the Youth Festival of Savitribai Phule Pune University. Competing among 69 colleges, MMCC students took part in categories such as music, dance, fine arts, literary arts, and theatre.

Notable achievements on this date included:

Students also participated in elocution, debate, quiz, mime, painting, rangoli, poster making, cartooning, clay modelling, mehndi, and photography. Faculty mentors **Prof. Meenal Kabra** and **Dr. Shilpa Kabra** guided students throughout the festival.

Indian folk dance forms—Garba and Dandiya. With 325 students participating, the event showcased vibrant attire, rhythmic movements, and festive energy, reflecting the cultural enthusiasm of the student community.

Elocution Competition

Held on **18th January 2025**, the Elocution Competition provided participants with an opportunity to speak on various themes, demonstrating clarity, articulation and critical reasoning. The event aimed to enhance public speaking skills and confidence among students. 28 students participated in this competition.

Healthy Bowl Competition

The Healthy Bowl Competition, conducted on **22nd January 2025**, promoted healthy eating habits and creative culinary presentation. Students prepared nutritious and aesthetically appealing food bowls, emphasizing wellness and mindful lifestyle choices. 57 students participated in this competition.

Clan Day

Clan Day 2025 was celebrated on **23rd January 2025**, featuring color and series-based dress themes. Students showcased creativity and unity by wearing coordinated outfits inspired by popular films, TV shows, characters, and conceptual themes. The event fostered teamwork and added visual vibrancy to the campus.

Bollywood Day

On **24th January 2025**, the college celebrated *Bollywood Day*, where students dressed as iconic Bollywood personalities. The day highlighted enthusiasm, glamour, and the creative spirit associated with Indian cinema.

Denim Day

Denim Day 2025, celebrated on **25th January 2025**, invited students to express their individuality through denim-based attire. Jeans, jackets, skirts, and shirts in varied combinations created a lively and stylish atmosphere on campus.

Indo-Western Day

Sur Aur Saaz - Singing & Instrumental Competition

contemporary categories. A notable highlight was the inspiring musical presentation by specially-abled, particularly visually impaired students, which received a standing ovation. A felicitation ceremony followed, acknowledging outstanding performers.
